When going from one special event to the next with little break and having to make up for the time we took off in our secular world, it is hard to think about anything else. Now that this period is over, we can take a breath and think about what we want to incorporate into our regular routine.

If you are like me, it might feel like you are constantly pulled to attend to the fire that is right in front of you rather than having time to light the fire you'd like to kindle. This month we will be starting a new cycle of our Intro to Judaism class on Thursday evenings 6-7:30. This is for Jews who want to supplement what they may have learned over their lives or for those who are not Jewish but want to learn.

The third Monday evening of the month, starting November 18, we will be diving into Jewish music through a curriculum developed by the Herb Alpert School of Music at UCLA and the Milken Center. Join us to "Sip and Learn."

Our Joseph and Gertrude Bowman Jewish Film Studies series sponsored by Diane Griffiths will resume on November 17 in Sisterhood Hall. Join us for a nosh and flick!

Our Jewish Book Club meets on Zoom the third Wednesday of the month and we have a Schmooze every Sunday morning. A short service precedes the schmooze at 9 am with someone bringing an offering relating to the Jewish world, writ large, at approximately 9:30. We are finished by 10 and would love to hear what you have to say or have been reading.

We read so much about people in our country feeling more lonely, anxious and depressed than at any time in our history. We also read that the best antidote to these feelings is social interaction. It may feel uncomfortable at first. However, like any other muscle, the more it is exercised the stronger it becomes. Hadassah at the UN: Members Lead Calls to Hold Hamas Accountable and Fight Antisemitism at the UN

In September, Hadassah volunteers participated in shaping the conversation around Israel and holding Hamas accountable for war crimes at the United Nations. As world leaders gathered in New York City to attend United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) meetings, Hadassah leaders spoke out, urging the UN and individual countries to designate Hamas as a terrorist organization and hold them accountable for their crimes against humanity, including the weaponization of sexual violence on October 7. Hadassah also weighed in with a powerful opinion piece pushing back against a problematic UN resolution that effectively strips Israel of its right to self-defense.

September 20, Hadassah cosponsored the Hostage Family Forum's "Not. One. More." Rally in New York City. Frieda Unger Rosenberg, co-coordinator of Hadassah's Education & Advocacy Division, proudly attended alongside other Hadassah leaders to call on Hamas to safely release the hostages immediately. Hadassah National President Carol Ann Schwartz authored a powerful opinion piece in Newsweek, highlighting how the UN's actions have emboldened Hamas terrorists and failed to hold their own employees responsible for colluding with Hamas. Carol Ann urged foreign leaders to take independent action to hold Hamas accountable.

Meetings with Foreign Ministers and Leaders: Throughout the week, Hadassah members attended meetings where they urged foreign leaders to help hold Hamas accountable for crimes against humanity, including sexual violence. Rosenberg represented Hadassah in a diplomatic meeting with Moldova, and Joyce Laiter, co-coordinator of Hadassah's Education & Advocacy Division, attended the American Jewish Committee's annual Global Jewish Diplomacy Reception.


