From the Cantor's Desk

With the 2024 election behind us, we are heading into the secular holiday period with a variety of emotions. Some may be looking forward to the new year excitedly with high expectations for change. Some may be anxiously looking ahead afraid of the direction of the changes. Some may be indifferent or of the view that whoever is in Washington, our state and local governments have little effect on our personal lives.

Without advocating for any particular stance or policy, I feel compelled to comment on what is causing me great anxiety – that is the demeaning and dehumanizing of the "other" that seems to be spreading in our public discourse. Regardless of whether one thinks that undocumented immigrants in this country should be deported, none of us should be comfortable with labeling such people as murderers, thieves, psychopaths or other demeaning terms. Any check of facts will show that the crimes that we experience cannot generally be laid at the feet of undocumented immigrants. But such labels and libels make it easier for the rest of us to justify whatever harsh and inhuman measures may be taken. The language used in describing immigrants, words such as "vermin," "animals," "insane," "criminal" and in conspiracy to weaken the country – should raise alarm bells for us in the Jewish community.

This is the kind of language that has been used so often to allow inhuman treatment by one group of another. Most of us have no moral quandary about exterminating rats or roaches, so calling a group of people "vermin" plays into the psychology that would allow extermination of the people. It is the language and attitude that allowed so many people in World War II to ignore or participate in the deportation and execution of the Jews of Europe. The same language justified Americans we would not generally say were cruel, sadists or sociopathic to condone and participate in such things as enslavement and abuse of blacks, relocation and "re-education" of Native Americans, internment of Japanese Americans, human trafficking and torture of suspected Islamic terrorists. In the book Ordinary Men (Harper Collins, 2017), Christopher R. Browning, a professor of history at Pacific Lutheran University, documented the activities of Reserve Police Battalion 101 of the German Order Police which was tasked with rounding up, deporting and executing the Jews of Poland and Lithuania. Browning points out that many of these ordinary, middle-aged working-class men were not fanatical Nazis but came to carry out atrocities, mass executions and deportations "out of a mixture of motives, including group dynamics of conformity, deference to authority, role adaption and the altering of moral norms to justify their actions."

We can debate immigration or any other policy or opinion about the state of the world and what changes are needed, but let's do so without demoting the "other" to less than status. As Jews, we have been on the receiving end of this treatment too many times in history not to understand the effects. No matter how much we may disagree with the opinion or actions of another, I exhort us to remember that such person is also human, and we should each strive to follow the teaching of the great rabbi Hillel – "that which is hateful to you, do not do to another." "That is the entire

Torah," he said, "the rest is interpretation."

#### **HADASSAH**

#### **IDF Representative Thanks Hadassah Hospitals**

Rear Admiral Daniel Hagari of the Israel Defense Forces visited Hadassah Hospital Ein Kerem in October to recognize and express gratitude for the exceptional dedication of the Hadassah Medical Organization (HMO)'s teams in treating war casualties.

Meeting with Prof. Yoram Weiss, HMO director general, Rear Admiral Hagari acknowledged the crucial work undertaken by Hadassah's staff, including the advanced surgical and rehabilitative care provided to soldiers injured in recent conflicts.

Since October 7, 2023, Hadassah has seen a significant influx of casualties from combat zones in both the south and north of Israel, with patients undergoing complex, lifesaving procedures and receiving extensive rehabilitative support. Prof. Weiss presented a comprehensive overview of the medical and technological advancements the institution employs, such as robotics-assisted surgeries and cutting-edge technologies used in its operating rooms. He emphasized the organization's commitment to treating each patient with the utmost urgency and care.

Central to the long-term recovery process is the Gandel Rehabilitation Center at Hadassah Hospital Mount Scopus, where wounded soldiers begin their recovery journey.
