From the Cantor's Desk . . .

Do you ever have those days when you don't want to get out of bed? I know I do. For me it's usually because I have to make some decisions, or I have tasks waiting that feel overwhelming. Call it anxiety, depression, perfectionism, procrastination – sometimes, I just want to disappear into a long novel, or two, or three, or start binge watching some silly series on a streaming service. All I want to do is escape to somewhere else and be a passive observer of someone else's life. I know this avoidance just makes whatever I'm feeling overwhelmed by worse. When I get up to do the thing or address the issue, whatever it is, I now have not enough time to do it which adds to the overwhelming feeling.

So what is it that gets me moving? For me it's usually my dog. My mood affects his mood, but he still needs to go outside, take a walk, have breakfast, play a little bit. Then I tackle just one thing. When I do the thing, that overwhelmed feeling abates and I feel like I can do another thing. It's easy for me to put off decisions I need to make for myself, but the thing that lights the fire is when I know someone else wants to be with me.

This month I will celebrate my second birthday while acting as Spiritual Leader of CBI. I have to admit that sometimes the thing that makes me want to stay under the covers with a book is trying to figure out what will grow our community. Not necessarily with new members, but with actual engagement of our current members. I am not a morning person generally, but when I know that there are some congregants who want to study at 8 am or do a service at 7:15, that gets me out of bed. It's the connection. It also is disheartening to work on activities, divrei Torah, music etc and not have anyone to share it with.

The Tanach gives us many examples of characters who reluctantly took on tasks even when not feeling up to it. The traditional explanation for what makes these people – such as Moshe, Jonah, David – undertake the task is often belief in God. Maybe, however, God shows up in the connection to the people who are relying on them. There is a spark, an energy, when we talk together, sing together, share what we are reading, thinking or feeling, that is missing under the covers.

I so appreciate the people who show up regularly in person and online, but there really are so few. If you are one of those people who find yourself wanting to hide under the covers, spend hours and hours passively watching others lives on the internet, I have a selfish request. Something I need from you that you just might find helps you, too. Join me at CBI for SOMETHING.
