From the Cantor's Desk . . . מְשֶׁנְּכְנֵס אֲדֶר מַרְבִּין בְּשִׂמְחָה

Mishenichnas Adar marbin b'simcha -

From the moment Adar arrives, we are to increase our joy. We enter March and Adar this year on the same day. On the 14th of Adar, we will celebrate Purim and read Megillat Esther. In the run up to this holiday that celebrates the triumph of our people over baseless hatred that would have seen all the Jews murdered, and then continuing on to Passover in which we celebrate our freedom from oppression, we are advised by the ancient rabbis to increase our joy.

This may seem particularly difficult right now for some as we mourn the senseless and brutal murder of the Bibas family in Gaza and the uncertainty from the restructuring or our world order and domestic government that is underway. However, it is just at times such as these that we need to come together, to celebrate, to socialize, to laugh and to love.

The first Shabbat in Adar (falling on March 1 this year), we will read from three Torah scrolls. Our weekly reading gives instructions for the building of the *Mishkan* – the Ark of the Covenant – that will carry the stone tablets through the desert. All of the children of Israel were called to donate what they wanted and the outpouring of resources was overwhelming. We will read also another paragraph regarding the requirement for each man over the age of 20 to pay one half shekel as a way to have a census. There was no distinction in amount based on wealth and the collections were given to support the needs of the Tent of Meeting and the *Mishkan*. The third portion recalls the sacrifices called for on the new moon.

I recently read an opinion stating that a reason for hatred of Jews may be related to the phenomenon of the Jewish people not disappearing despite being a "conquered" nation. Throughout the generations, Jews have clung to their cultural heritage, perhaps even more than to religious beliefs. And so, perhaps the greatest threat to our people is not anti-semitism, but the disconnection of those in our community and discontinuation of our heritage. If you are reading this, it means you still feel a connection to our "tent of meeting," Congregation Beth Israel and to the Jewish people. Let's think about what that means to each of us and make ourselves count. Whether it's with the minimum contribution to the maintenance of the tent of meeting, or by generous voluntary donations of our time and resources. Is our contribution wearing our Jewishness proudly? Doubling down on a commitment to oppose baseless hatred? Stepping up to be present in the synagogue? Making our commitment known to our children and grandchildren and instilling that connection in them?

We each have our own contribution to make and if we do so, we can truly increase the joy in our community. Wishing you all a month of Adar filled with joy and commitment.
