From the Cantor's Desk

Shana tova to all and I pray that you be sealed for a year of blessings, goodness and peace.

I am writing this during the aseret y'mei t'shuva, the ten days of repentance between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur. The name for this period seems to imply that these 10 days are like the "open enrollment" period for repentance. If you miss it, you're out luck until next year.

Judasim, however, teaches that t'shuva is possible and desirable at any time. It is never too early or too late to recognize the error name for this period?

Rosh Hashana is also known as the day of judgement. Our liturgy says that each of us is judged on Rosh Hashana and the decree will be sealed on Yom Kippur. So these 10 days do take on some feeling of "get it while supplies last."

I would like, however, to promote a different idea. For some this may the only time of the year that we take time off work or school and out of our daily lives to be Jewish. Even for the most observant, this is often the period when we feel closest to God, to the spiritual and ethical side of our Judaism. Expanding on an idea from Rabbi Yhudah Aryeh Leib Alter, a 19th century Chasidic rabbi of the Gur dynasty in Poland, perhaps this is the most important time to review ourselves and made amends exactly because it is the FIRST 10 days of the year, and not because it is the last days before a deadline. When we start out on a new project, we try to do it right. We do not embark on something new purposely going the wrong way. Of course, we make mistakes along the way, but at least in the beginning we want to start clean.

The Rambam taught that t'shuva requires three things. First confessing the mistake, putting it right (if possible), and not doing the same thing again. This twelfth century teaching sounds very much like steps in a twelve step program. May we all have the awareness and courage to do real t'shuva this year, to make amends, autocorrect and embark on 5786 on the right path.


